I. Course Description:

Literature Course 2 is a course that teaches students reading strategies and literary terms through various forms of writing such as short stories, informative text, essays, folktales, poetry, graphic story, etc. Students will be able to access their background knowledge to relate to the text through connecting what they have experienced so that they can have a better understanding of what they are reading. They can make predictions and inferences by accessing their prior knowledge. In addition, they will be able to expand their vocabulary through discussions and analyzing the structures of the texts.

II. Course Objectives:

- 1. Students will learn different reading strategies (eg. identify cause-and-effect relationships, identify sequence, analyze setting, determine main idea and supporting detail, recognize author's purpose, analyze evidence, distinguish fact and opinion, analyze style, and draw conclusions about characters)
- 2. Students will learn literary terminologies such as narrator and point of view, plot, setting, character, description, characterization, theme, author's purpose, diction, imagery, rhyme, mood, and dialogue.
- 3. Students will expand their vocabulary through context, usage and discussions.
